#### 1. Presidents Message Bob Wyatt

- I have reached out to most subgroup leaders over the past week. Assuming issues related to Covid continue to improve, all appear to be in support of a resumption of meetings in the fall. Some hosts are toward leaning toward restricting early fall meetings to fully vaccinated attendees.
  - Subgroup leaders want to start in the fall
    - Luthier subgroup leader may require COVID vaccination
    - Mike O. Moore may require vaccination too
    - Bob Lacivita will start meetings in his converted barn
    - Woodturners will start in the fall
      - Un-vaccinated people will be required to wear masks
    - Owain Harris will be available for meetings / classes
  - Possible in-person BOD meeting venue found at Concord Firefighters
     Union Hall, Located near Concordia Church. Will negotiate monthly rent
     when their facilities coordinator gets back home from a camping trip to
     the white Mountains. I will ask if this location may also be available for
     some small meetings.
    - Meetings will continue to be the fourth Wednesday of each month
    - In the past we have paid \$30 /mo. for meeting space. The
      Firefighters Union said that would be okay for use of their hall
      - No small meetings on the weekend at their meeting hall
      - They have tables and chairs and Wi-Fi
      - No pool table however
    - The Firefighters could use a shed outside their hall

 It was recommended that it is less expensive to buy a ready made shed than to make one

#### 2. <u>Secretary Report by Philip Glover</u>

- Approval of the Meeting Minutes of 04/28/2021
  - Minutes for April will be voted on / approved at the June meeting due to not all members receiving the minutes before the meeting
- No discussion

#### 3. Treasurers Report by Jim Forbes

- Financial documents were emailed to the B.O.D. prior to this meeting by Jim Forbes
  - o \$17K will be reduced buy uncleared checks
    - \$4,800 for the General Fund
    - \$10K for the Journal
    - Remainder for one time expenditures
  - Question Bob W.
    - What about the money market report?
  - o Ans. Jim F.
    - Money is moved from bank to checking acct.
    - Transfers are made 3 to 4 times a year usually \$5K at a time
      - This time it was \$10K
    - Money market account earned 74¢ this month

#### 4. Membership Report by Jim Seroskie

- Membership report was emailed to the B.O.D. prior to this meeting by Jim S.
  - o 668 members as of this meeting time
  - o 53 of 121 (~44%) donated their credit card fee
  - Two-year membership has grown since last year
  - o About 5% of the membership is from outside New England

#### 5. Journal / Website updates by Jim Seroskie

- Puritan Invoice
  - Puritan has been printing the Journal for the last 12 years

- Puritan was bought out by Major Mail
- o 715 88-page Journals printed
- o It's \$13.50 per Journal to produce
- 15.3¢ per page was the lowest ever
- Average cost to mail 663 journals is 63¢ each
- Mailing extra copies via USPS is \$3.40 each
- Some members refuse paper copies
- Fall Journal will be 40 pages
  - Need ten authors
  - Garret Hack wants to wright an article

#### 6. Touch Ups report by Claude Dupuis

- Will need to do more work as the sub-groups start up again
- Luthiers need to more information about their activities
  - Comment Bob W.
    - Add Concord address for Making Matters
  - o Comment Jim S.
    - Would like to share the Calendar work burden
      - TicketTailor helps with sharing calendar management
    - Subgroup leaders should do their calendar management

#### 7. Update on E-Mail Issues by Jim Seroskie

- NeonCRM released a major upgrade to mass email capability in April.
  - Mass emails to membership must be sent from either Constant Contact (TouchUps) or NeonCRM (Guild database)—not personal email. Both are "Reputation Servers" which protects the Guild domain reputation and deliverability.
  - Jim S created How-To for others to send mass emails to subgroups, etc. using the Neon database
  - Elliot was first to send to Period Furniture + HandTools & Carving subgroups
  - Other subgroup leaders are encouraged to communicate directly with their members by this means.

#### BOD@gnhw.org email

- We have used Google Groups as an email forwarding tool for a number of years. There have been Issues with delivery failures with no insight into reasons.
- Switched to forwardemail.net for one week. Very basic with new problems, no insight and no response to help requests.
- Switched to mailgun.com. Full featured with log, spam rejection and ticketing capabilities. Jim S is happy with this choice.
- Found that all BOD member emails to bod@gnhw.org on Mailgun were delivering except emails sent...
  - From Claude (yahoo account) to Phil, Gary, Mike (comcast, comcast, aol)
  - From Mike (aol account) to Phil, Gary, Claude (comcast, comcast, yahoo)
- Issue is Comcast, AOL and Yahoo subscribe to a DMARC policy to varying degree which can cause...
  - Messages that have a domain in the FROM Address that differs from the SENDING Domain to be quarantined, marked as spam, or rejected completely.
  - Mike said he will create a gmail account—TBD
  - Claude has a gmail account which he may use for BOD communication—
  - Jim S can find no deliverability issue with Phil or Gary sending emails from Comcast
- GSWTboard@gnhw.org mail list should also have same problems with 5 of 8 members on Yahoo or Comcast. They may need to revert to previous practice of each individual maintaining their own board list.

#### SPAM

- Mailgun performance—Found that the majority of spam was being rejected over a six-day period (25 rejected with additional 19 delivered). Still too much getting through
- Problem believed to be the many emails listed on the Guild Contact web page.
- Rather than publishing these emails, Jim S will change to a small set of contact forms.
